

Management of Medical Emergencies in the Dental Office A Combined <u>Didactic</u> and <u>Hands-on Skills</u> Course

Emergency topics covered include:

Chest pain including MI, stroke, syncope, allergic reactions, asthma and breathing difficulties, seizures, hypo/hyperglycemia and local anesthetic toxicity.

Discussion of office emergency kits and preparedness.

Hands-on skills practiced include:

Patient assessment and vital signs, oxygen use, airway management and emergency injections.

The optional hands-on afternoon session will include real-life in-office scenarios of emergencies and their management. Apply what you have learned!

Goal: upon completion of the course participants will understand the approach to these emergencies *and* have the necessary skills to manage them in their offices. NOTE: The half-day course meets the Provincial Dental Board's criteria for the required CDE emergency course per cycle, including post-test. It also qualifies as the pre-requisite for Dalhousie University's Nitrous Oxide course. This custom designed course is taught entirely by paramedics who manage and teach emergencies routinely!
